This funding will be used to


- Increase the percentage of students in the school working at or above the NAPLAN National Minimum Standard in Reading.
- Increase percentage of students receiving results in the Upper Two Bands in NAPLAN Reading.
- Increase the percentage of students reading at or above their age appropriate level.
- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'C' standard or above in Literacy.

Our initiatives include


- Empowering staff to deliver effective strategies for the teaching of reading.
- Provide facilitated planning and data analysis for teachers (once per term).
- Align strategies across the school to create an effective whole school approach to reading.
- Provide professional development, coaching and access to view best practices to ensure staff development of their understanding and deconstruction of the Australian Curriculum.
- Increase teacher aide time to facilitate school based reading programs.
- Professional development for teacher aides to effectively consolidate student learning of reading.
- Purchasing resources that can be used in the delivery of reading programs.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Allocating funding to increase teacher aide time in school to deliver reading programs. (\$9006)
- Release teachers (TRS) to engage in collaborative data inquiry, pre and post moderation of units and whole school planning and professional conversations. (\$3280)
- Purchase a teacher for one day a week to oversee Student Support programs such as Early Start, Daily Rapid Reading, Reading Link, Learning Support and Student Verifications. (\$19871)
